

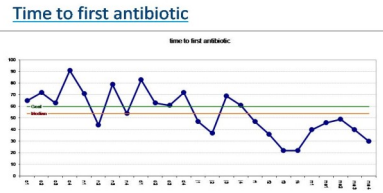

**SPSP Improvement Networking Day**—presentations from the recent SPSP Improvement Networking day are available [here](#).

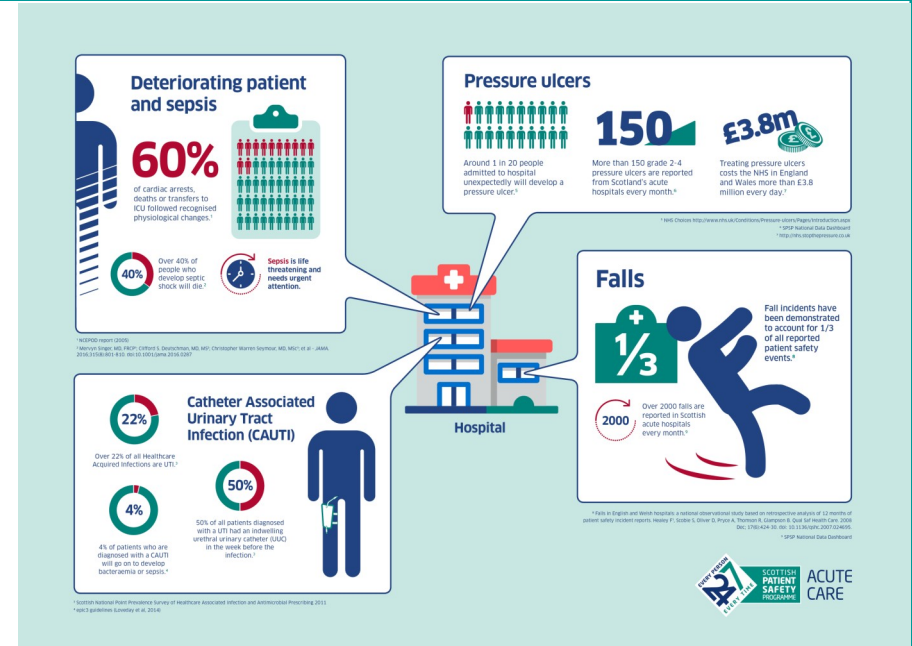

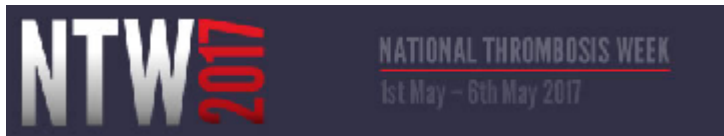
