WHAT TOPICS WOULD YOU LIKE TO FOCUS ON?

- **Support for evaluation and delivery** – guidance on data collection and information sharing agreements, central space for resources, and implementation support for local contexts.
- **Specific MAT Standards** – learning sessions on MAT 6, MAT 9, and MAT 10.
- **MAT Standard 7** – engagement and collaboration with primary care services, partnership working with GP practices, and challenges with rurality.
- **Role of families and third sector** - improve understanding of non-clinical support and ways of working.



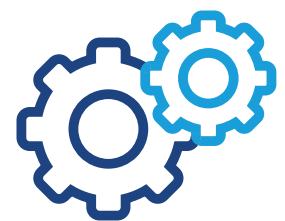
WHO WOULD YOU LIKE TO HEAR FROM?



- **Local examples of practice** – challenges and enablers, progress with evaluation, real stories and voices, implementation in remote and rural areas.
- **National boards and teams** – Scottish Government, MIST team, NHS Boards and related services such as primary care, acute services, 'out of hours' teams.
- **Guest speakers** – lived experience speakers, Minister for Drugs and Alcohol Policy, and David Best.
- **Third sector organisations** – bring knowledge about what support is available and how to access it.

WHAT LEARNING WOULD YOU LIKE TO BE SUPPORTED WITH?

- **Trauma Informed Practice** – access to trauma informed care training, guidance on providing trauma responsive practice.
- **Stigma** – involving communities, approaches to reducing stigma when accessing a 'Harm Reduction Van' in rural areas.
- **Further training** – national opportunities to access Psychologically Informed Environments and quality improvement training.
- **Partnership working** – services working together to implement MAT Standards 6 to 10, information on prison pathways, community development, and primary care.



HOW WOULD YOU PREFER TO ENGAGE WITH EACH OTHER?



- **Access to all engagement options** – having options is important due to wide range of attendees.
- **In person, face to face sessions** – useful format for networking.
- **Virtual sessions with breakout chat rooms** – some attendees are remote working.
- **Localised development sessions** - supported by HIS and MIST teams.
