Virtual Learning Session 1

How to Start a Service

21 October 2020

The first in a series of Hospital at Home virtual learning sessions took place on 21 October. The topic of the session was 'How to start a service'. Presenters involved in the development of Hospital at Home in NHS Lanarkshire and NHS Fife spoke about their experiences of starting the service in those areas.



NHS Lanarkshire were the first Hospital at Home team to start up in Scotland. They began with a one week trial where they saw 10 patients, 8 of whom were able to be kept at home. This was then followed by a 6 month pilot starting in December 2011.



NHS Fife soon followed, setting up their first service in 2012 in West Fife. Over the next 2 years the service was rolled out across Fife. Initially the service was for people aged 75 and older but this has now been expanded to all adults with frailty.

Impact of Hospital at Home in NHS Lanarkshire and NHS Fife

- Significant impact of patients being in their own home and having their own food.
- Continued support from social services.
- Decline in hospital referrals in both areas.
- NHS Lanarkshire – of an average 3,000 patients seen per year, c. 80% are seen at home.
- Positive patient, family and carer feedback.

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Keys to Success

- The NHS Lanarkshire and NHS Fife teams both expressed the importance of involving GPs in the process.
- Clear data and measurement are important to know where improvement needs are and to highlight successes.
- Clear governance and structure are important for long term success.
- Relationship building to build confidence.
- Multi-disciplinary Teams are a key part of the success of Hospital at Home.
- Start small being mindful of the end goal.

Challenges

- Due to initial uncertainty about the benefits of the Hospital at Home service, funding was often raised as a challenge, especially in the early days.
- General resistance to change and challenging the traditional environment.
- Clearly communicating what Hospital at Home is and is not, making it clear that it is not simply primary care.
- The management of rural areas.
