Thank you for joining the Person-Centred Planning and Dementia Workshop via MS Teams

We were delighted to have 49 participants from health, social care and the third sector join us from across Scotland for our online workshop on Thursday 19 August to share examples of practice and talk about enablers and barriers.

The workshop featured Gillian Gibson, Lead Nurse and Kerry Lowe, Senior Charge Nurse (NHS Fife HSCP) who shared their Holistic Assessment Tool for in-patient settings. Emma MacLellan and Clare Anderson, Post-diagnostic Support Link Workers (Alzheimer Scotland) presented an example of a personal plan for post-diagnostic support.

Following the presentations, participants joined breakout rooms to give smaller groups the opportunity to explore practice together. In each of the six breakout rooms the groups undertook an exercise, using the [Wise Crowds Liberating Structures](#) format, to share a challenge around person-centred planning. The person who volunteered this challenge then left with some helpful suggestions to try in practice.
